One item that was discussed at some length, and which continues to causes us concern, is that we are regularly hearing comments and complaints about poor etiquette by club members. Etiquette does not only relate to how you treat your partner or your opponents. It encompasses all manner of bridge play and we ask that you be mindful of the following points. Please do not

- .touch your bidding box until you have decided on your bid
- .put your bidding cards away before the first card has been led
- .enter information in the bridgemate and your personal scorer before making your first lead
- .give unintended information to your partner
- .play cards out of turn
- .allow dummy to select cards for you when declarer. Please nominate the card you wish played
- .discuss boards just played which in turn passes on information to nearby tables

New laminated signs were recently placed around the club highlighting expected etiquette.

We were recently instructed by a Telstra employee that we **MUST NOT** park at the eastern end of the Telstra car park where the road swings around to the right (on either side). We also have to keep clear the section of driveway immediately on the right as you enter the gates as Telstra require clear access to the tower situated on our property.
