For 15 consecutive years, during the second week of August, I visited Queenstown with the same group of friends for skiing. They were all bridge players. After a full day of skiing, sauna, dinner at a nice restaurant, and a different place for dessert, they returned to one of the rooms, opened their wine bottles, and played bridge. As a chess player and semi-professional blackjack player with the ability to count cards, I initially refused to bow to pressure from this group to learn and play bridge. Instead, I opted to play blackjack at one of the two casinos there. Eventually, I gave in, and after just 5 minutes of instruction, I was hooked. Upon our return to Sydney, I purchased several elementary bridge books, read internet articles, and enrolled in a six-week bridge course at the North Shore bridge club. After three lessons, and typically not paying attention to details, I showed up for my lesson on Melbourne Cup Day, only to discover there was no lesson, only an open duplicate session. A lady whose bridge partner didn't show up asked if I could play, and I agreed. We came in second place, marking the end of my lessons as I graduated to the open section. A few months later, I participated in my first Congress and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. I am highly enthusiastic about bridge conventions, having studied almost every major convention and introduced three of my own with the help of a math guru. During my extensive travels, I actively seek out bridge clubs as a great way to meet people and join social circles. I have played bridge in many countries, the highlights include three months in Antigua, Guatemala and six weeks in Cuenca, Ecuador. Since May of last year, the Gold Coast has been my home. I relish being a member of the Gold Coast Bridge Club, where I received a warm welcome, appreciating its friendliness and spirit of cooperation.
